

Dominion Voting exposed for critical vulnerabilities

Dominion Voting Services, after winning \$787 million in a settlement with Fox News, has suffered a fresh embarrassment. An unsealed report by a computer expert finds that Dominion Voting machines are vulnerable after all. And legacy media organs are now admitting it.

Dominion Voting embarrassment

As [*WND* reported](#), a 96-page report by an election security expert highlights “critical vulnerabilities” that affect Dominion Voting Services machines. A bad actor can use the security holes to negate “all ... security mechanisms.”

Alex Halderman, Professor of Computer Science at the University of Michigan, filed the [report](#) in July 1, 2021. A judge hearing a lawsuit to forbid the use of Dominion machines in Georgia has unsealed the report.

The machines at issue are Ballot Marking Devices, which disabled voters can use to mark scanner-readable ballots. But apparently in Georgia, *all* voters must use these devices. Voters do not even have the option of using a ballot they mark by hand. Worse, the device produces a Quick-Read code human beings cannot read.

On Friday, NBC News ran a story that for once did not ridicule the notion that someone could subvert electronic voting machines. According to NBC, the Division of Elections *could* address some (not all?) the issues with software upgrades. But *too many machines would require those upgrades*.

Prof. Halderman himself appeared to recommend against using Dominion ballot marking devices.

Halderman also left his *curriculum vitae* online in case anyone doubts his word or his expertise.

Dominion Voting Services, despite their settlement, are rumored to be in financial difficulty.
