Barack Obama, moral relativist

Leaving the evidence aside for a moment, what do we know with some certainty about Obama's mentality? He has correctly been called America's first "post-American" President, but what does this mean?

It means that Barack Obama rejects, at least in principle, America's two foundational documents, the Declaration of Independence and the Federal Constitution.
